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Dear Parents / Carers,

We hope you have had a lovely summer. We are looking forward to welcoming all children back to school on Thursday 2nd September 2021.

We are writing to inform you of the procedures that will be in place when the children return to school in September, following our consideration of the guidance from the DfE. We are delighted that we are able to return to a more 'normal' school life. From September there is no longer a requirement for children to be kept in separate 'bubbles' and therefore we will no longer be operating staggered start and end times and pupils will be able to gather together again at break time and lunchtime and for assembly.

The school gates will open at 8.50am please continue to drop pupils off at the school gate where they will go round to their classrooms straight away. All pupils must be at school by 9am for registration. If your child is unwell and will not be attending school please contact the school office by 9.30am.

School will finish at 3.20pm, pupils will be collected from the school playground. Please line up by the sign for your child's class and the pupils will be brought to the playground and dismissed by their class teacher. If you have more than one child at school please collect the youngest child first.

We are continuing to ask pupils to come into school in their PE kits on the days they have PE. This will be Wednesday for Robins and Blackbirds and Friday for Owls and Eagles. This will commence on the first full week back at school week beginning 6th September.

School dinners are free for all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. For pupils in Year 3 and 4 please remember to pay in advance on Parent Pay (unless your child receives free school meals).

If an individual develops COVID-19 symptoms or has a positive test they must follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. They should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19. Where a child might start showing signs of symptoms in school, they will be transferred to a separate room and parents will be contacted immediately. The child will remain in the separate room, carefully supervised, until they can be collected. The household (including any siblings) should follow the PHE (Public Health England) stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.
